Dear Family of Faith at Zion Lutheran -

As well, if you have health issues that place you into a high-risk group, please stay home. Please take your temperature and assess symptoms prior to arrival (<u>www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/symptoms-testing/symptoms.html</u>). If you have any doubt about these or they are out of the norm, for the good of the whole, please stay home.
