I was there to learn about the assignment that I have been given and excitedly look forward to three years of growth in a growing congregation. I was also there to meet Kara. I'm happy to this day that God had that in mind.

The Bible talks a lot about marriage, in fact, Christ's love for His Church is shown in the one man-one woman, lifelong, covenantal relationship of marriage. It's wonderful. It's sacrificial.
