Telling the Stories

"Because he holds fast to me in love, I will deliver him; I will protect him, because he knows my name.

When he calls to me, I will answer him; I will be with him in trouble;

I will rescue him and honor him. With long life I will satisfy him and show him my salvation." (Psalm 91:14-15 ESV)

The other day I checked how many people in the Unites States make it to age 96. The answer wasn't shocking: .03%. As a fraction, that is 3 out of 10,000. Even AI says, "that's very rare."

As I stand by the bed of a dear member and think about what she has seen in 96 years, heard in 96 years, faced and forgotten in 96 years... I am moved to awe. I immediately think of the aches, pains, problems, issues, news articles, job turmoil, and difficulties I have faced in nearly half a century – and it makes me breathless to realize she's seen almost double the revolutions around the sun (along with all that comes with that).

Now sure that time was full of sin, death of people around, temptations that are the same yet coming in new packages. Still, in 96 years there were how many more sunsets, smiles, and joys beheld. Bagels eaten, laughter, and times shared with friends (in this person's case)? There were many more hugs, songs sung with her congregation, and grandkids to see grow. And how much more of God's faithfulness did she get to see, God's love in Christ did she hear and sing about, God's work did she behold, God's grace in the cross and empty tomb did she get to meditate on and apply in life? Not everyone is given 96 years – in fact 3 out of 10,000 get there. Yet no matter how long a life God gives – may He daily satisfy you (and her) daily with His salvation in Christ! -PJ
