## Devoting Ourselves to the Word

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. 2 Corinthians 5:17

"Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words will never hurt me." I guess someone thought up this old saying to help children not worry about what other people said to or about them, to teach them that words can't really hurt you.

Well, we all know that's not exactly true. Words can cause lasting emotional pain. Words like "rejection", "failure", "I hate you", "why can't you ...", "you look ...", "I never wanted for you to be born", "you are a disappointment". We sometimes feel like we are always being told that we aren't smart enough, aren't good looking enough, aren't good enough, can't get the job done, aren't strong enough. This list could go on and on. It's little wonder that many people carry with them mental and emotional pain every day.

Famous people will sometimes say that the trick is to just not listen to or read what other people are saying about you. Ignore it. I'm sure that works for some of them, to a degree. But I'm also sure the jabs sometimes still get through. And what if the hurtful words are said by a loved one? A family member or a close friend? How do you ignore that?

There is One, however, who loves you unconditionally. Who doesn't judge you based on how you look or on what you do, who doesn't judge based on accomplishments (or lack of). Who is glad that you exist because He made you and died for you. He is closer to you than your closest friend or family member.

Rather than ignore what the world says, which is much easier said than done anyway, shift the priorities. Know that what God thinks of you, who He says you are, is infinitely *more important* than what others say or think about you.

Last week, I wrote that being baptized means that your name has a new meaning: "(insert your name here) belongs to God". Baptism has another meaning: who does God say that I am? Here are a few things that God says about you: "redeemed", "loved", "forgiven", "created", "part of God's family", "worth dying for".

If you have been baptized, think about what God has said about you, what God says to you. Sometimes it's hard to ignore what the world says, but the truth is, what God says (your baptismal identity) is infinitely more important. If you have not been baptized, hear God's desire to give you a new identity, a baptismal identity in Christ. - CG
