Devoting Ourselves to the Word

Is there any encouragement from belonging to Christ? Any comfort from his love? Any fellowship together in the Spirit? Are your hearts tender and compassionate? Then make me truly happy by agreeing wholeheartedly with each other, loving one another, and working together with one mind and purpose. Don't be selfish; don't try to impress others. Be humble, thinking of others as better than yourselves. Don't look out only for your own interests, but take an interest in others, too. You must have the same attitude that Christ Jesus had. -Philippians 2:1-5 (NLT)

At my field work church in St. Louis, we had a phrase that the whole congregation would say at the end of the children's message: "Children of God, you are loved by the Father, led by the Spirit, and you belong to Jesus, and no one else." This statement was not only true for the children of God at St. Trinity, but it is true for the children of God here at Zion, and for every child of God around the earth. What does it mean, though, to live like we are loved by the Father, led by the Sprit, and belong to Jesus? In this passage from Philippians, Paul says it means living in community with your fellow believers, working together with one mind and having the attitude of Christ. The attitude of Christ is humble and self-sacrificing; it puts the needs and concerns of others above our own. When we belong to Christ, we belong to something bigger than ourselves, and, led by the Spirit to do so, and encouraged by the love of the Father, we live for the good of others over ourselves. We live together and rely on each other, sometimes even with people we may not want to, and we do so joyfully, because that is what the community of the fellowship of believers is all about. - JW
