Telling the Stories

Five youth and two adults attended the Ohio District Sr High Youth Gathering the weekend before Thanksgiving, Nov 21-23. This was the first time the gathering had been held since the pandemic – a 5-year break. Prior to the pandemic the gathering had been held every year for at least twenty years.

The Bible studies were titled Caring Connections and were designed to help kids support one another in Christ. Many of their friends are not Christians or do not have a strong relationship with Jesus and the study helped the kids to understand that they can be a caring presence and bring the comfort of Jesus to their friends.

The studies were led by youth and adults from the Ohio District Youth Ministry Team, and one of those team members is our own Leah O'Grady, who began her service on the team shortly before the gathering. Leah is a blessing to our youth ministry leadership team here at Zion and now she is also serving teens throughout Ohio!

We did a service project of going to an assisted living home in the Columbus area. We had two jobs: wash doorframes and railings, and make a craft to give to the seniors to cheer them up. The craft item we made was a gnome. I don't know what the style of craft was, but it was very difficult (I am not crafty at all!), but the kids learned quickly and made a lot of cute gnomes to give away.

Kids met new friends from around the district, especially Jess, who was the only youth participant from her church. She spent a lot of time with our group, especially with the other girls, and they got to know each other very well and are already looking forward to next year's gathering.

On Saturday night, we had a devotion in the sanctuary by candlelight, giving everyone a chance to pause and reflect and connect with God through song, His Word, and prayer. The event closed with a communion service at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church in Columbus, OH, and was a great way to close the event – worshipping God together with other gathering participants and with the congregation that hosted the event.

We are looking forward to this event again next year, as well as getting the kids together through the many other activities that will happen between now and then.

Devoting Ourselves to the Word

2 Corinthians 7:1-10

We are preparing our hearts and minds for Jesus' birth during this Advent season. In this epistle reading, Paul is comforted by the coming of someone else: Titus.

Titus was given a difficult assignment. He was to go to the Corinthians and bring a challenging message to them: they needed to repent of their immorality and division. Paul did not know how the Corinthians would respond to this message, but they responded favorably with repentance and eagerness to receive God's forgiveness and a restored relationship with God and also with Paul. Titus brought to Paul good news!

What about us? Do we judge others and put them down as a way to feel better about ourselves? Do we let others keep on sinning because we are afraid of being seen as judgmental? Who is "Titus" to you, calling you to repent? Who are you "Titus" for, calling them to repent and assuring them of God's unconditional love and forgiveness?

Titus accomplished Paul's mission to the Corinthians. Jesus came to earn for us God's forgiveness and salvation. In doing so, He accomplished God's mission. We can prepare our hearts and minds for baby Jesus by acknowledging our sinfulness, repenting (be truly sorry), and receiving God's unconditional love and forgiveness through Jesus.

Prayer: Lord, give us knowledge of Your Word and will, wisdom to know when we should speak to those we love, and hearts to speak and hear both Law and Gospel in love.
