OLD TESTAMENT READING

Isaiah 49:1–7

¹ Listen to me, O coastlands, and give attention, you peoples from afar. The LORD called me from the womb, from the body of my mother he named my name. ² He made my mouth like a sharp sword; in the shadow of his and he hid me; he made me a polished arrow; in his quiver he hid me away. ³ And he said to me, "You are my servant, Israel, in whom I will be glorified." ⁴ But I said, "I have labored in vain; I have spent my strength for nothing and vanity; yet surely my right is with the LORD, and my recompense with my God." ⁵ And now the LORD says, he who formed me from the womb to be his servant, to bring Jacob back to him; and that Israel might be gathered to him—for I am honored in the eyes of the LORD, and my God has become my strength— ⁶ he says: "It is too light a thing that you should be my servant to raise up the tribes of Jacob and to bring back the reserved of Israel; I will make you as a light for the nations, that my salvation may reach to the end of the earth." ⁷ Thus says the LORD, the Redeemer of Israel and his Holy One, to one deeply despised, abhorred by the nation, the servant of rulers: "Kings shall see and arise; princes, and they shall prostrate themselves; because of the LORD, who is faithful, the Holy One of Israel, who has chosen you."

EPISTLE

1 Corinthians 1:1–9

¹ Paul, called by the will of God to be an apostle of Christ Jesus, and our brother Sosthenes, ² To the church of God that is in Corinth, to those sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints together with all those who in every place call upon the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, both their Lord and ours: ³ Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. ⁴ I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that was given you in Christ Jesus, ⁵ that in every way you were enriched in him in all speech and all knowledge— ⁶ even as the testimony about Christ was confirmed among you— ⁷ so that you are not lacking in any gift, as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ, ⁸ who will sustain you to the end, guiltless in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁹ God is faithful, by whom you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

crowd gathered about him, and he was beside the sea. ²² Then came one...
...of the rulers of the synagogue, Jairus by name, and seeing him, he fell at
his feet ²³ and implored him earnestly, saying, "My little daughter is at the
point of death. Come and lay your hands on her, so that she may be made
well and live." ²⁴ And he went with him. And a great crowd followed him
and thronged about him. ²⁵ And there was a woman who had had a
discharge of blood for twelve years, ²⁶ and who had suffered much under
many physicians, and had spent all that she had, and was no better but
rather grew worse. ²⁷ She had heard the reports about Jesus and came up
behind him in the crowd and touched his garment. ²⁸ For she said, "If I
touch even his garments, I will be made well." ²⁹ And immediately the flow
of blood dried up, and she felt in her body that she was healed of
her disease. ³⁰ And Jesus, perceiving in himself that power had gone out
from him, immediately turned about in the crowd and said, "Who touched
my garments?" ³¹ And his disciples said to him, "You see the crowd pressing
around you, and yet you say, 'Who touched me?'" ³² And he looked around
to see who had done it. ³³ But the woman, knowing what had happened to
her, came in fear and trembling and fell down before him and told him the
whole truth. ³⁴ And he said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you
well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease." ³⁵ While he was still
speaking, there came from the ruler's house some who said, "Your
daughter is dead. Why trouble the Teacher any further?" ³⁶ But
overhearing what they said, Jesus said to the ruler of the synagogue, "Do
not fear, only believe." ³⁷ And he allowed no one to follow him except Peter
and James and John the brother of James. ³⁸ They came to the house of the
ruler of the synagogue, and Jesus saw a commotion, people weeping and
wailing loudly. ³⁹ And when he had entered, he said to them, "Why are you
making a commotion and weeping? The child is not dead
but sleeping." ⁴⁰ And they laughed at him. But he put them all outside and
took the child's father and mother and those who were with him and went
in where the child was. ⁴¹ Taking her by the hand he said to her, "Talitha
cumi," which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise." ⁴² And immediately the
girl got up and began walking (for she was twelve years of age), and they
were immediately overcome with amazement. ⁴³ And he strictly charged
them that no one should know this, and told them to give her something
to eat.
