Telling the Stories

Last weekend, eight youth from Zion attended the Quake youth gathering at the Holiday Inn Eastgate. The theme was "Anchored" and was based on Hebrews 6:19a: "*We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and secure.*" Anchored in God's promises. God who cannot lie and will always do what He says He will do. God who made Jesus our great high priest. God who is bringing all of us to spiritual maturity.

Devoting Ourselves to the Word

“The Lord is your keeper; the Lord is your shade on your right hand. The sun shall not strike you by day, nor the moon by night.”-Psalm 121:5-6

I know that in the middle of January, it is hard to imagine the relentless beating of a hot sun. Perhaps you would find it easier right now to imagine a bitter cold wind on a dark night. Either way, I want you to take a moment to imagine yourself outside, with the full force of the elements surrounding you.
